

## STUDENT PARKING

---

Student parking for the school year will be limited due to student population. Seniors will have the first chance to sign up for parking during pre-registration in May, followed by the juniors.

### Eligibility Requirements

- Senior or junior based on credits earned to date (2.0 cum GPA).
- Valid driver's license, insurance, no outstanding obligations.
- Parent/guardian signature for approval.
- Parking sticker will cost \$10.00 per student per year.

### Parking Lot Regulations

- Student parking permits are required for parking on campus.
- Speed limit is 5 mph.
- School buses have the right-of-way at all times. No loud sound systems in parking lot at any time.
- Students must park in the front parking lot only.
- ***After parking, students are to immediately exit their vehicles and go to class or check in. Vehicles cannot be used as lockers.***
- Students will not be allowed in the parking lot without written Administrative permission.
- Students transported to or from campus by non-students other than family members must have permission filed in the main office.
- Vehicles cannot be moved once parked without administrative approval.
- Leaving campus unauthorized will result in disciplinary action and/or loss of parking privileges.
- Violations will result in disciplinary action/parking fines.
- ***Student vehicles (includes vehicles on campus/school function site) are subject to search upon reasonable suspicion for prohibited or illegally possessed substances or objects.***

## DISCIPLINE

The following policies shall be used to govern student conduct at all school-sponsored activities and at any time the student is under school jurisdiction. **It is the responsibility of the students to become knowledgeable of and to abide by these conduct policies.** Titusville High categorizes behavior into two types: Inappropriate Behavior and Exceptions.

### INAPPROPRIATE BEHAVIOR

The teacher will take at least **three actions, including one parental contact (by phone or mail)**. Other interventions may include written notice to a counselor, teacher/student conference, or detention in an attempt to correct inappropriate behavior before referring a student to the administration.

#### *Inappropriate Behavior Examples*

- Profanity or Vulgarity
- Public Affection
- Misconduct
- Dress code violations
- Insubordinate Behavior
- Out Of Class Without a Valid Pass
- Disorderly Behavior In Class, Hallways, On Campus, Or At School Functions
- Items Such As Radios, Tape & CD Players, Beepers, Camcorders, IPods, MP3 players, and Cam-
